The Christian Arts Academy at Ivy Creek UMC offers

classes in the arts while exploring a biblical theme. The Academy is open to all children in the community, rising Kindergarten to 8th Grade, and is offered free of charge. This year we will explore the

abundance of God's creation through

stories of meals with Jesus, where he provides for

all whom he invites to his table. We will learn about breakfast (John 21:1-13), lunch (Luke 19:1-10), and dinner (Luke 10:38-42) with Jesus, a midnight snack (Luke 11:5-13), and having a party with the King (Luke 14:15-23).

All family members are invited to attend our opening meals at 5:30 p.m. After four evenings of working in the arts, on Friday, we will have our final gathering and gallery opening. We will have performances, demonstrations and other types of sharing from the classes, followed by dinner and time for browsing the art "exhibits."

We will also raise awareness of hunger in our community and the world. We invite everyone to bring an offering each night of canned or boxed food for a local food pantry. In addition, on Friday night we will receive an offering to help the Society of St. Andrew, a mission in Big Island, Virginia, that gleans and distributes food.

Classes are led by experienced practitioners of the arts and with the help of many classroom assistants. Rising Kindergarten and 1st grade students will have their own classes and crafts.

Students ages rising K-8th grade will choose two classes, many of which will be geared to their particular age group, and some of which will include students of all ages. Learning takes place in a fun and relaxed environment. Give careful consideration to your six choices, and register as soon as possible, as some classes have limited space. Classes may be combined or canceled depending on interest level. If you know you will miss one or two nights or the Closing, please register for classes which do not include group presentations or weeklong projects (marked * on the registration form). Please note that some of the courses have minimum age requirements. Ask for help in choosing appropriate classes if needed!

Registration deadline is July 16th. We will do our best to honor your first requests, but participation in classes may be assigned based on availability of space.
